IN MEMORY OF GLENDORIS SARGENT 1931-2023 A VALUABLE CVV FOUNDING MEMBER



Glendoris Ruth (Kilbury) Sargent was born in Newton, IA on February 3, 1931, to Paul and Carol Kilbury. The family moved to Southern California when Glen was 8 years old. She attended UCLA for 3-1/2 years, leaving school to marry Laurence Sargent. Their daughter Toni (Eshyah) was born in 1952. Glen and Laurence divorced, and she enjoyed life as a single woman, working as a legal secretary. In 1990, Glendoris and her second husband, Walt, moved to a home on Mt Dell Drive in Clayton. They bought several homes which they rehabbed and sold, and traveled the world together, and were happily married for over 30 years until Walt's death in 2013. He was definitely her soulmate.

Did You Know?

Outdoor Fitness Area at Willow Pass Community Park



CONCORD, CA (Nov. 29, 2023) — City leaders, staff, and community members gathered on Nov. 20 to celebrate the completion of two exciting projects at Willow Pass Community Park: the new Salvio Street crosswalk and a brand-new outdoor fitness area.

The park has long served as the City's premier sports complex, with lighted sports courts, ball fields, and athletic fields that support a wide range of activities (pickleball, anyone?).

The new outdoor fitness area is the first of its kind in Concord. Situated west of the pickleball courts, the 2,000-square-foot space features a variety of KOMPAN brand equipment including magnetic "bells" for weightlifting, two stationary bikes with touch screens (control the tension using an app on your phone!), suspension trainers, a multi-purpose net, step/jump box platforms, and more.

Each piece has a QR code, which links to information on how to use that particular station. Additionally, Concord's Recreation Services team is planning to offer instructor-led classes at the fitness area beginning in 2024.

Funding for this project was made possible through Proposition 68, the California Department of Parks & Recreation grant, in conjunction with City funds, which allowed for the renovation of the old infrastructure and the addition of new lighting, fencing, and rubberized surfacing.

The goal of this new facility is to keep residents – of all ages and abilities! – active and healthy by offering a free, accessible place to work out during park operating hours, 6 a.m. to 10 p.m.



Agatha's Aghast

Or she would be if she could see how some French actors have turned her well-known mystery stories on their heads. The three main characters comprise Chief Inspector Laurence (Lowrhance), the quintessential well-tailored 40-something French male bachelor; Alice (Aleece) Avril, the opposite, an unkept impetuous female newspaper employee currently serving as the local newspaper's "Dear Abbey" staff writer, but with ambitions to become a crime reporter; and the tall, elegant, no-way your Hollywood dumb blond, but good-hearted and eminently likeable Marlene (Marleen), the Inspector's secretary and ultimately a loyal friend to Alice.

They romp through the Poirot and Miss Marple novels with great energy and enough missteps to make you wonder how they could ever solve the crimes. But they do - to the viewer's amazement and enjoyment. Yes you need to read subtitles but I consider that a free speed reading course, well worth the extra eye movements.

(You can locate the DVDs on line with some looking but again, well worth it. The Berkeley Rasputin's had sold them in the 1980s but they are not readily available locally).




