### **CVV Joins Regional Village Organization**

Clayton Valley Village is now a member of BRAVO (Bay Regional Area Village Organization.) Set up just this year, the organization provides a means for exchanging information and ideas among villages. More than 20 Bay Area villages are represented, both open and in development, making BRAVO the second largest regional village group in the nation.

õBRAVO® birth is timely, since the main national resource organization, the Village-to-Village network is reducing its staff and beginning to operate more from volunteer support from local villages,ö says CVV president Maria Xiaris.

õWeøre proud that CVV was instrumental in getting this regional network,ö she says.

BRAVO plans to meet quarterly, rotating amongst village locations. The previous meeting was in Sausalito in September.


