

## New Vetting Process for Board Members and Volunteers

CVV is switching to a new security screening company for 2019. All Board members and Volunteers will now be screened by "Intellicorp," a company vetted and recommended by our two insurance agencies. Further information will be announced at our annual meeting, but all members should be assured that this transition will be virtually invisible to most. #### How to Remove Water Stains from Wood? TOOTHPASTE!





A inexpensive stain-remover that is readily available in every household is toothpaste. Toothpaste can cost as little as \$1, so it's a great choice for those who don't want to buy specialty products. Simply rub some NON-GEL toothpaste onto the affected area with a soft cloth. Then wipe it away with a damp cloth and let the spot dry before completing the next step. After drying, apply a small amount of furniture polish.

Easiest Way to Open a Stuck Jar Lid



Wrap it in Rubber Bands!

This method is similar to using a gripping tool, but instead of a rubber jar opener you are using rubber bands to get a better handle on the lid. For this method, take a few thick rubber bands and wrap them around the lid. This gives you something to hold onto that isn't the smooth lid, and makes the jar easier to grip and open.
