CVV's 2ND ANNUAL MEETING HELD ON JANUARY 17

Twenty-eight members and volunteers attended our second Annual Meeting at Hoyer Hall in the Clayton Library on Thursday evening wearing their CVV t-shirts and greeting each other over delicious home baked treats. Outgoing President, Sonja Wilkin, thanked the 2018 Board of Directors and Committee Chairs and, in the absence of treasurer Joanne Wasak, presented the 2019 budget which was voted on and approved.

Sonja gave an update of CVV's participation in local, regional, state, and national Village organizations highlighting the upcoming BRAVO (Bay Regional Area Village Organization) meeting on January 30 which is being cohosted in Lafayette with the other two Contra Costa County Villages (Lamorinda and Walnut Creek). She also explained what it means to be part of the Village Movement California and Village to Village Network, our national umbrella.


Pete Bardea then presented some of the in-depth data reports he creates not only for CVV but for other Villages who request them.
