

Bart's 50th Anniversary



50 years of service: A look back at BART's electric opening day

In celebration of BART's 50th Anniversary this year, we're looking back at the transit system's five decades of service and innovation in a new series of stories. BART celebrates 50 years on Sept. 11, 2022.

Fifteen years of planning. Eight years of construction. More than \$1 billion. On September 11, 1972, BART finally opened for service.

The day was electric. Estimates suggest that more than 15,000 people showed up to test out the new, plushy-cushioned seats on the state-of-the-art trains. The attendance figures may sound low; when BART opened, only 18 two- and three-car trains ran the first day along the first 28-mile section of track, from MacArthur Station to Fremont. More than half the stations would open in the coming weeks, months, and years. The Transbay Tube – one of the technological jewels of the project – opened two years later, in 1974.

In his book, "BART: The Dramatic History of the Bay Area Rapid Transit System" (2016), former BART employee and historian Michael Healy describes the ribbon-cutting ceremony at Lake Merritt headquarters plaza: "The celebration was kicked off by a local high school band, and thousands of people gathered to hear speeches by numerous local dignitaries, including San Francisco mayor Joe Alioto and Oakland vice mayor Frank Ogawa, among others."


Just in time for Halloween

NETFLIX: 3 Seasons

The resemblance to the latest Ghostbusters movie is only in the characters and set-up: a spooky old house inherited by a widow from her recently dead spouse.

The widow and her youngest son, accompanied by his teen-aged brother and sister, move in.



The boy discovers occasional whispers that he alone hears, lead him to discover various keys which open doors in the house to miraculous rooms. One room opens an individual's mind so he or she can explore it (what a boon this would be to psychiatrists).

Throw in a mysterious unsavory female formerly trapped in the property's historic well-house; the murderer of the kids' father, who darkens the teenagers' dreams; and the reluctance of neighbors to discuss what happened on the property years previously when their father and his friends had inhabited the house, string you along to whatever end awaits on or before Halloween.

NETFLIX: 1 Season

For the more imaginative (or possibly those that once haunted comic-book shops in their hey-day), there is the older series "The Sandman" based on the graphic novels of the same name.



Excellent acting and marrying the mundane with the special effects worlds in which the Sandman (aka Morpheus, the god of dreams) seeks to regain the items stolen from him while he was trapped by an "amateur magician.

This includes a duel with the fallen angel who now rules Helland whom he defeats with quite clever and thoughtful dialog. (Neil Gamin was one of the producers of this and of "Good Omens" - a sequel of Good Omens is due in 2023).


