Raspberry Bars – submitted by Sonja Wilkin

Ingredients

- 3/4 cup butter, softened
- 1 cup sugar
- 1 large egg
- 1/2 teaspoon vanilla extract
- 2 cups all-purpose flour (or substitute the same amount of Bob's Red Mill "1 to 1" gluten-free flour to make a gluten-free version)
- 1/4 teaspoon baking powder
- 1-1/3 cups sweetened shredded coconut
- 1/2 cup chopped pecans
- 14 ounces of raspberry preserves or jam (almost a full jar)*

Directions

- 1. Preheat oven to 350°.
- 2. Grease a 13x9-inch baking pan.
- 3. In a large bowl, cream butter and sugar until light and fluffy.
- 4. Beat in egg and vanilla.
- **5.** In a small bowl, whisk flour and baking powder; gradually add to creamed mixture, mixing well. Fold in coconut and pecans.
- **6.** Press a little less than two-thirds of dough onto the bottom of the greased 13x9-inch baking pan.
- **7.** Spread with preserves; crumble remaining dough over preserves.
- **8.** Bake 30-35 minutes or until golden brown. Cool completely in pan on a wire rack. Cut into bars.


Book, Movie & TV Reviews

The Swedish Art of Aging Exuberantly by Margareta Magnusson (2022)

This is a witty look at how to live and age gracefully well into your final third of life. It's a short 140 pages because, as the author says, "old people don't want to read 400 pages."



It's a humorous yet useful look at how to approach life when more of it is behind you than ahead. Simple and pragmatic advice is given such as not to fear death but to focus on what's important now: beauty, friends and loved ones, those less fortunate, leaving a better place for your children and grandchildren.

Along the way her advice includes admonitions to wear stripes, live within your means, don't resist new technology, let go of what doesn't matter, keep an open mind, spend more time with young people and have that gin & tonic with a friend on a regular basis.

It is also available on Peacock.

The most important ingredients in Peacock's unscripted series, are of course, the Swedes. And the ultimate de-cluttering program has a trio of them, each of them an expert who brings a unique set of skills to each episode.

We will meet at Grove Park by the restrooms at 9AM sharp and carpool to BART. If you will meet us at BART, let the group leaders know. Please be on time or be left behind. Bring a sack lunch or snack and your Clipper card. If you already have a Clipper card, we can board upon arrival at BART. We will disembark at the Embarcadero stop and board the Presidio GoBus (free) in front of the Hyatt Regency hotel for a short ride to Transit Center Presidio where we will spend time at the visitor center, have lunch and use the restrooms. We will then board the Presidio Go bus, South Hill route, for a short scenic ride with stops at Immigrant Point Overlook and Baker Beach. Be prepared to walk through some loose sand to the beach area or not, your choice. We will try to keep the walks to about 3 miles total. Then back to the Transit Center for restrooms, then board the Presidio Go bus downtown and disembark at Clay and California and walk to Embarcadero BART for home. Expect to return on or before 4PM.

CVV Celebrated Members' Birthdays for Q3 - September 21st












CVV's annual Ice Cream Social was held September 19th
