
CVV is asking Brewer to address some of the most crucial issues facing the Clayton Valley group as it moves toward opening in 12 to 18 months. These issues are

- Governance infrastructure the transition from a working board to a governing board and all that it entails.
- Fee structure full membership and possible social membership
- Fundraising training, help in identifying foundations, local businesses, major donors

Brewer, who lives in Rockridge, is a consultant to non-profit organizations. She has worked closely with many Villages including Ashby Village and at San Francisco Village, where she served as temporary director for several months.


