At the November Board meeting new board members and officers were chosen for 2020 and it was agreed that Carol Hansen Grey would step off the Board to serve as Executive Director *(an unpaid, volunteer position)* for a period of 6 months beginning in January. CVV has never had an Executive Director so this position is a "trial run" to see if having an Executive Director would be beneficial to the organization as a paid position. Carol's role will be to raise awareness of the organization in the Clayton/Concord area, to help grow the membership base, to plan and implement new educational and civic based programs that serve the Clayton/Concord community, and to research and implement new fundraising strategies. Carol brings with her the experience of having served for 5 years as the Executive Director of an international nonprofit. She will be working closely with the new incoming president, Susan Manning.

We look forward to 2020 as CVV grows and expands into the greater Clayton Valley community. Our January issue will have more information about our new Board members who will take office on January 1. They will be officially introduced to the membership at Annual Meeting to be held on February 19th at Hoyer Hall from 7:00-9:00 pm. Coffee filters... Who knew? And you can buy 1,000 large filters at the Dollar Tree for almost nothing.

1. Cover bowls or dishes when cooking in the microwave. Coffee filters make excellent covers.

3. Clean windows, mirrors, and chrome... Coffee filters are lint-free so they'll leave windows sparkling.

4. Filter broken cork from wine. If you break the cork when opening a wine bottle, filter the wine through a coffee filter.

5. Weigh chopped foods. Place chopped ingredients in a coffee filter on a kitchen scale.

6. Hold tacos. Coffee filters make convenient wrappers for messy foods.

7. Stop the soil from leaking out of a plant pot. Line a plant pot with a coffee filter to prevent the soil from going through the drainage holes.

8. Put a few in a plate and put your fried bacon, French fries, chicken fingers, etc on them. It soaks out all the grease.

9. Put baking soda into a coffee filter and insert into shoes or a closet to absorb or prevent odors.

- 10. Use them to strain soup stock and to tie fresh herbs in to put in soups and stews.
- 11. Use them as a spoon rest while cooking and clean up small counter spills.
- 12. Use them to wrap Christmas ornaments for storage.
- 13. Use them to remove fingernail polish when out of cotton balls.

One of the things we hear from our members is that they don't think about putting in a service request because they can usually do most things themselves. One of the reasons to join Clayton Valley Village is to use the services of our volunteers to help you with tasks around your home and yard. Here is a sample list of things that volunteers could help you accomplish:

• Light yard work, Install smoke detectors, • Help organizing an office or garage, • Help rearranging furniture, • Hang pictures or mirrors, • Fix or replace a hinge or door knob • Flip bed mattresses, • Take down or put up a curtain rod, • Replace light bulbs, • Lubricate doors, • Replace heater/refrigerator filters, • Install shower head, • Paint mailbox, • Replace a door screen, • Replace toilet seat, • Replace toilet tank flapper, • Adjust toilet tank water level , • Replace doorbells, • Change smoke alarm batteries, • Make a thermostat work, • Set up TV, cable and garage remotes, • Reset an irrigation timer, • Tighten garden hoses, • Reset breaker box or GF1...once. • Help with computer issues, •Repair a drip in an irrigation line, • Lift heavy boxes, • Move patio furniture, • Pot plants (in



pots, not in ground), • Install solar yard lights, • Help setting up and taking down Christmas decorations, • Bring things down from attic using pull-down ladder (with second volunteer).



New Circle Forming in 2020




